Topper's Mountain, New England

Topper's Mountain vineyard is a high-altitude, cool climate vineyard near Armidale in the GI of "New England, Australia" on the western edge of the New England Tablelands at an altitude of 900m. The vineyard is situated on beautiful, deep, red volcanic soils on the watershed high above the valleys of the Gwydir & MacIntyre Rivers.

Topper's Mountain are the leading exponent of rare & non-mainstream varieties in New England & Australia such as Gewurztraminer, Tempranillo, Touriga, Pinotage, Nebbiolo, Barbera, Petit Manseng, Tannat & Tinta Cao with some Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Noir & Chardonnay thrown in for good measure!

2011 saw the first release of the Topper's Mountain wild ferment Viognier, barrel ferment Petit Manseng & Vintage Touriga (vintage port). Our Red Earth Child, Nebbiolo, Tannat & Pinotage Viognier are already receiving critical acclaim from the likes of James Halliday, Simon Hughes, Nick Ryan & Tony Harper.
